True Craftsmanship of Building a Sportfishing Yacht


Behind the Scenes of Building Symbols of the American Way of Yachting

In North America, there are numerous professional shipyards that specialize in building classic and innovative sportfishing yachts. These shipyards range from large companies with many launches and new productions each year to small manufacturing companies that build boats one at a time. No matter the size, these shipyards provide the same attention to detail and individuality.

The experts at Bayliss Boatworks (Wanchese, North Carolina) gave us an insight into the manufacturing of these beautiful yachts — a maritime symbol of the American way of life. Together with Daniels Boatworks (also located in Wanchese, NC), these two yards emphasize the importance of fairing and finishing a sportfishing yacht to receive the final brilliant surface.

We spoke with yard owner, John Bayliss, about the spirit of building a sportfishing yacht. He knows, that the quality of a boat is based on the craftsmanship and technical know-how of the shipyards. The foundation of good work is the philosophy with which the experts approach their customers and suppliers. "Relationships with our owners do not end upon the delivery; our team continues to support owners throughout the lifetime of the yacht", says John who has worked as a fulltime charter captain and commercial fisherman for 27 years before making the switch to boat building.

To implement this service and quality philosophy at all levels, the shipyards naturally need suppliers who live the same spirit and fulfill it with individual, reliable products - from materials for interior fittings to mechanical components for the engine room and products for the painting process. "A build can take anywhere from 1.5 to 3 years and is separated into several stages", explains John.

FXCFLLENCE STEP BY STEP

1 Design & planning

Owners meet with the supervisors and design team of the yard to bring their vision to life. The build cycle of the boat is completely planned out months before the jig is built.

(2) Hull construction

The hull and cabin are built out of wood. Jigs and stringers are set, and then the hull sides are planked and sanded, then the hull is faired, glassed, and flipped.

(3) Interior buildout

The interior of the hull is built out for the main mechanical components of the build. The hull sides are insulated, and bulkheads are installed.

4 Mechanical

The main mechanical components are installed including the engines, running gear, generators, fuel tanks, gyros, water makers, refrigeration, and air conditioning.

5 Exterior buildout

The cabin is installed, and the cockpit/mezzanine buildout begins.

6 Interior cabinetry

The interior cabinetry team creates mockups and then builds handcrafted, custom cabinetry items for the interior of the yacht. Each item is built with hand selected wood and is installed in the various rooms of the yacht.

(7) Electrical

The electrical panel is built and wired, and the mechanical components of the build are wired.

(8) Paint

The paint team sands and primes the yacht, and then the yacht enters the paint booth for final paint. After final paint, her tower is installed.


9 Sea trial

The engines on the custom sportfishing yacht are put to the test, and then the yard crews complete all finishing touches before she is delivered.

(10) Christening

The completion of each build is wrapped up with a christening party. The vessel is prayed over, a bottle of champagne is broken over the bow and the owners and crew celebrate with the yard employees and their families.

DANIELS BOATWORKS AT A GLANCE Founded in 2016, the company is also family-run by Kurt Daniels, who together with eight employees is focusing on one new building each at the moment. Like Bayliss Boatworks, Daniels Boatworks is located in Wanchese, North Carolina. 63'er is their latest project. Pictured in the water is the 60'er, just completed about eight months ago.

SPOT ON THE FAIRING & FINISHING

From the first layer up to the final finish, it is important to rely on good product quality and process-safe application parameters. John, from Bayliss Boatworks, gave us insight on the fairing process, and Kurt, from Daniels Boatworks shared on the importance of the final topcoat.

John Bayliss about the FAIRING

If the substrate is not fair, the entire paint process will look bad. The fairing process is just as important as the last coat of paint. We hand block sand our fairing rather than use a machine sander like you would see in production-style boat building. Our paint department uses battens to ensure the fairing has been sanded to the correct height. This allows them to get an up-close and detailed analysis of the fairing and shape. ALEXSEAL® fairing products help us to consistently produce quality results.

Kurt Daniels about the final TOPCOAT

The topcoat is the cherry on the cake of the entire painting process and, in the end, what makes for an impressive finish. However, as John rightly says, this clearly depends on the work and product quality of the other layers. Gloss and DOI are of course particularly important on sportfish yachts, but so is durability, as well as repairability, should damage ever occur while fishing. This importance applies to both solid and metallic colors. For both, ALEXSEAL® topcoats and additional products such as the blender for metallic spot repair are highly recommended.

At the Heartbeat of the Industry

Explore a normal day of our Technical Sales Manager, Marcel. A road trip through the Dutch yacht coatings industry

The Netherlands are one of the epicenters of the European yachting industry, and Dutch shipyards and suppliers enjoy the highest reputation worldwide. The small country on the North Sea is also a high-tech hotspot for the painting of yachts and superyachts. To meet the high demand for expertise in the broad-based yachting industry, we have two highly experienced and long-standing coatings experts, who provide technical, craftsmanship and design advice to our customers on a daily basis. We had a chance to talk with one of them in between his many appointments.



Sailor, Surfer, Sales man

Marcel discovered his passion for yachts and water through sailing and windsurfing in the 70s. In 1982, he worked for the first time in the nautical business in Greece. Five years later, he started as a Junior Sales Rep at a global paint manufacturer.

He has been married to his wife, Petra, since 1995. In 2007, he joined the ALEXSEAL® family as a Technical Sales Manager for the Dutch market. Speed and staying on course guide him not only in his professional life, but also in his hobbies of snow boarding, kite surfing and mountain biking.

An interview with Marcel Voskamp about a "typical" work day of a Technical Sales Manager

Marcel, glad you could spare us a moment. Where are we catching you right now?

In the car which is my office and second home. I'm just on the way to my second on-site appointment.

But it's only 8:30. What time do you start the day?

After a good cup of coffee, I'm in the car from 6.30 am onwards. Depending on where my first customer is located, I'm in the car for up to an hour and a half. After that, I have between three to six appointments per day, depending on the length of the appointments and the distance between each customer.

(A second caller is on the line and Marcel puts me on hold – the customer always comes first with him. Some Minutes later ...)


Sorry, that was a customer, who bought our Roll Additive and had a question about the application and mixing ratio.

In preparation for our interview, I spoke with a good colleague of yours. He told me, "If you have a yacht coating question in Holland that no one can answer, then call Marcel." — Are you a telephone information desk for yacht painters?

(laughs) I've been in the yacht coating market since 1982. That's where my name and my cell phone number also got around a bit, yes. But that's just what I love about my job for 40 years. To help and to assist people.

It's a complex business with sometimes very challenging and large projects. Building a yacht always involves a lot of money





and, above all, passion on the part of the owner and all the people who build her. It would be an outrage if I didn't put all my heart and soul into it. And it doesn't matter whether we're talking about a 10 meter or a 100 meter yacht. The desire for perfection, a perfect finish and individual support is always the same.

How can we imagine the tasks you get in front of the bow during the day?

Oh, they are very extensive. My biggest appointment today is at a shipyard, where a 60 meter yacht is being launched that was painted with our metallic system. There we will see for the first time how our paint with its high gloss level performs in the water. These are always very nice visits, where everyone involved is very proud to see the result of months of work.

Another project meeting today takes me to the very beginning of a project - with a small yachtbuilder specializing in motor yachts. There we create spray samples and a mock-up for the sampling of a refit project. In the late afternoon, I have a third appointment with the applicator of a shipyard and the owner's representative to review the current status of the painting work.

And in between, when I'm behind the wheel again, I'm on the phone with customers and our office staff to make sure that everyone gets their paint and filler on time, in high quality and in the right quantity.

Oh yes, on the way home I'll stop by the end user, who called earlier about the roll additive. I'm very curious about the finish.

What makes the Dutch yacht market unique in your eyes?

In the Dutch nautical business, it is almost without exception down-to-earth guys and girls who work there. Always direct and honest in communication, always at eye level and always with the same premise: No matter what the challenge is, we make it happen for the customer. That is one of the strengths that makes our market so respected around the world.

What time will you be home tonight?

I told my wife that if everything goes normally, I'll be back at 7 pm. Then I'll go for a short ride on my mountain bike to clear my head a bit

(At that moment, someone beeps in again, and Marcel says goodbye to me with the words, "We're through, aren't we?" There it is again, the Dutch straight forward communication he praised. Meanwhile, I keep my fingers crossed that the phone call will not jeopardize his mountain bike tour. But in case of doubt, he will make the extra round not for himself but for his customer.)

Thank you, Marcel, for the great insights of a normal day in the world of yacht coatings.






